TIPS FOR A GREAT DESIGN-

Make your lettering read-able. The more fancy and complicated your lettering is, the harder it is to read. Pick a simple graphic. Graphics (pictures) have to be clear, large, and viewable. Fine details can get lost on a small logo image. Make sure your design has something to do with the subject! Horses, horseshoes, riding gear, tack, etc. are all good illustrations for the Rendezvous. Make SURE you include all the necessary information! Be creative- there are thousands of tee shirt designs online and many in your own bureaus! You may borrow ideas, but put your own "twist" on them! Remember to submit your best work- erase pencil marks, make sure your paper is neat and clean, and show pride in your work.

Be sure to put your name, club, rating, phone number, and age on the BACK of your design. Use pencil to write it so that it doesn't show through.
